Dear Friends,

Happy New Year! I agree I am a little premature in sending greetings for 2024 but accurate according to the Church year and its seasons. This magazine will be available in the churches on Advent Sunday, 3rd December, the first Sunday of the Church year, and covers December and January and three great seasons of the Church - Advent, Christmas and Epiphany.



Little children love to receive Advent calendars depicting the countdown to Christmas, but we adults miss a trick if we fail to focus on the distinctive features and significance of Advent. The essential theme of Advent is expectation: expectation of the anniversary of the birth of Christ on Christmas Day but also expectation of the second coming of Christ, at a time known only to God the father.

I am indebted to a friend and fellow parishioner, Elisabeth Colquhoun, for having alerted us to the fact that the Basingstoke Choral Society and the Docklands Sinfonia were to perform Verdi's Requiem yesterday afternoon, which was appropriately the Sunday when we celebrate Christ the King. It was a magnificent performance and the choir sang by heart. The drums and trumpets thundered during the *Dies Irae*, *Dies Illa* (day of judgement day of wrath), but there was immense tenderness in the appeals to Christ for peace and mercy. I would urge you to look at a score or to google a translation of the libretto.

There are many lovely distinctive hymns available for Advent, it is good that we will enjoy these in our services before embarking on the Christmas carols, but Christmas Carol services will take place in St Bartholomew's and St Lawrence' churches on Sunday 17th December at 6pm.

There are particular features of Advent which we mark in our benefice. Some people like to join in a house group. This year two are operating, looking at a study for Advent created by the Bible Reading Fellowship. It is called "Journeying through Advent with New Daylight." If you would like a copy of the booklet to read, please speak to me or Tom Nell. We will also be holding the Advent Sunday lunch in St Lawrence Parish Room at midday on 3rd December after the service. Delicious soup, cheese and fruit and no need to book! Wishing you a thoughtful Advent and a joyful Christmas and Epiphany.

Hyde Parish Hall: The proposed sale of the Hall by the PCC of Hyde to the Winchester Muslim Cultural Association (WMCA) continues to follow the due legal process and is expected to be completed early in the New Year. The sale will enable the PCC to devote the care and attention to St Bartholomew's Church that it needs in order to remain viable into the future, as a place of living history, living faith and living community, and there are exciting plans for its refurbishment in due course. The WMCA are looking forward to having a proper base for their long-standing and highly regarded community activities, as well as for their prayers. As Christians, we share with the Muslim community our ancient roots in faith and our desire to love and serve our neighbours, so this will also be a positive step in inter-faith relationships, for the benefit of the city. Winchester Churches Christmas Project 2023

This year, Winchester Churches Christmas Project reaches a remarkable milestone - 30 years of helping Winchester people at Christmas.

There is no 'one size fits all' - offers of help are very individual, and families can choose what would help them most. This might be exciting stuff like Christmas food and presents or a special treat. However, it could be something much more prosaic such as the payment of a worrying bill or a top up of the gas or electricity.

We demonstrate our Christian faith and witness in our help and care for those we visit. Last Christmas we were pleased to have been able to help 34 families (53 adults and 57 children) plus 2 single people - a total of 112 people. Thank you all!





New Bishop of Winchester's 'Service of Welcome' at Winchester Cathedral

The service at Winchester Cathedral on Saturday 13th January 2024 will be the formal ceremonial occasion at which the new bishop takes up his office, an historic and important event in the life of the city and the diocese.

The service will begin at St Lawrence Church, where Bishop Philip will make the necessary oaths and declarations. He will then be met in The Square by the Mayor of Winchester, the Chief Executive of Winchester City Council, the Roman Catholic Bishop of Portsmouth, and the Headteacher and a pupil representative from The Bishop of Winchester Academy in Bournemouth. Together they will process slowly and prayerfully to Winchester Cathedral.

According to tradition, Bishop Philip will then knock on the West Doors of the Cathedral and be greeted by a child who asks the question 'Why have you been sent to us?', to which he replies, 'I come as one sent as Bishop to serve you.'



The themes of love, humility and service will continue throughout, in the prayers, oaths and in the beautiful selection of music, including the anthem 'Love Bade me Welcome' (a setting of George Herbert's poem by Ralph Vaughan Williams), chosen by Bishop Philip and sung by the Cathedral Choir and the Junior Choir.

The involvement of children will be central to the proceedings, including performances from school choirs and the presenting of the crozier (hooked staff) by a child.

Other symbolic ceremonial acts during the service include the 'installing' of the bishop into his 'cathedra' (throne), anointing the new bishop with holy oil, and a final act of blessing which takes place outside the cathedral when the bishop will pray for the city of Winchester and the whole diocese.

Bishop Philip will also preach the sermon, his first public address since he legally became Bishop of Winchester and an opportunity for him to express his hopes and priorities for his leadership.

The Cathedral and diocese are also delighted to be welcoming some special visitors at the service, including Archbishop Angaelos, Coptic Orthodox Archbishop of London, and other friends from the Anglican Communion overseas, including the Bishop of Rumonge in Burundi, and the Bishop of Karongi in Rwanda.

The service is a ticketed event only; a few tickets were made available for each benefice, and ours have been allocated by Revd Karen. All the proceedings, including the procession from St Lawrence Church, can be watched on the 'Cathedral Channel' at www.winchester-cathedral.org.uk

Climate Change and Linked Causes of the Growth in Infectious Diseases

Some thoughts by Richard Stead

Many of you know that I develop cures for infections caused by all kinds of pathogens. Weekly I read of changes in growing levels and types of infections and how previously low levels of infections are becoming pandemic status. **Covid** is the best recent example. There is a growth in **sepsis**, with no approved treatment to cure it. We can also expect to hear of coming **fungal** pandemics.

Diarrhoea remains the third largest cause of death among the young around the world, despite a significant reduction in childhood mortality related to diarrhoea over the past 2 decades. **Shigella** (a contagious intestinal bacterium, a relative of the well-known *escherichia coli*) is the most widely reported cause of bacterial diarrhoea in low- and middle-income countries. It is food-borne and water-borne, and it can be deadly for children with poor immune systems. Research in China and Africa has shown a direct link between temperature change and the frequency of shigella infections.

Local remedies have widely been used due to the non-availability and cost of pharma medicines. The efficacy of local treatments is diminishing because the pathogens that are causing the diseases are changing. Endemic areas are enlarging/reducing as the geography and conditions are changing, and many of the carriers (eg water or mosquitos or flies) are moving into new areas as conditions change. Populations that have developed relative immunity over decades no longer face the problems, but new populations are threatened. Climate change is accelerating the emergence and spread of what become "superbugs" and, with unprotected humans on which to feed, they thrive in new warm and wet conditions. Higher temperatures promote growth, infection and spread of antibiotic resistance in bacteria, both in humans and animals.

An increase in rainfall will also result in increased run-off from farms and industry and consequently result in higher pollutants in the water. The increased nutrient levels from agricultural run-off will enhance bacterial concentrations and boost opportunities for the transfer of antibiotic resistance genes.

Droughts present problems too. Water scarcity leads to reduced sanitation and results in higher densities of people sharing the same water source or using contaminated water for agricultural purposes.

As the global population grows, the shared environments of human and animals are increasingly overlapping and that increases the likelihood of pathogen transmission between animals and humans, eg **Bird Flu**.

I believe the problems are mainly down to human stupidity, greed and selfishness. I wish I could find cures for those three human pandemics!



The charity of St John's is launching their first ever matched <u>Big Give Christmas Appeal</u> in aid of their Dementia Support service.

Led by two resident Admiral Nurses and a Dementia Support Worker, the Dementia Support service has already helped more than 300 individuals living with dementia in the 12 months since it was launched. Yet with an estimated one in six people in their 80s and one in three people aged 90 and over developing dementia, the team face an impossible mission: to meet the ever-increasing demand for the service whilst maintaining the same level of exceptional care.

The Dementia Support service receives more than a dozen referrals every month. Each requires several in-person and telephone meetings, cross-service connection and communication, and careful, considerate case management. The team builds close relationships with each family, carer and the person living with dementia, providing a lifeline during an otherwise often lonely and isolating time.

Fundraising is now critical for St John's to not only sustain but increase our capacity to deliver exceptional care and support.

The target for the Big Give Christmas Appeal is £10,000 which would enable an increase in the number of Memory Wellbeing Centres from fortnightly to weekly. As this is a matched campaign, every donation up to a total £5,000 will be doubled!

The website gives us an update on the extraordinary way this charity, supported by St Lawrence with St Swithun parish, is still managing to carry out its vital eye surgery in spite of the conflict around them. They say,

Recent events in Israel and Gaza have both shocked and horrified the St John Eye Hospital Group and the broader international community. As a charity that has worked in the region for more than a century, we have one aim: saving sight, changing lives.



Our job is to provide internationally recognised and award-winning eye care services to patients regardless of ethnicity, religion, or their ability to pay.

But we know first-hand the damage that the escalating conflict will bring.

The people affected are some of the most underprivileged in the world and this war will create a severe humanitarian crisis, on a scale not previously seen.

Amid the hostilities, chaos, and uncertainty the work of our hospitals and clinics in Gaza, the West Bank and East Jerusalem remain more vital than ever.

While our hospital in Gaza has sustained heavy collateral damage and remains non-operational, as St John Eye Hospital Group (SJEHG) staff have fled to the south, all our services across the wider region are under severe strain.

In the West Bank and at our flagship hospital in East Jerusalem, which treats many of the most complex eye cases from across the West Bank and Gaza, increased movement restrictions mean that many patients are unable to attend our facilities.

During this time, we are doing everything we can to ensure the continuity of our services. We are providing transport across the West Bank and Jerusalem to patients who would otherwise be unable to attend our facilities, and some of our smaller regional clinics are starting to carry out more complex treatments.

Update on essential bridge replacement works at Tunbridge, Garnier Road

Winchester residents will be very frustrated to learn that work being done on the old 100 year old bridge in Garnier Road will be further delayed. The road was closed in March this year and due to reopen in November, but the reopening has now been delayed to February 2024.

Councillor Nick Adams-King, the County Council's Executive Lead Member for Universal Services, said: "It is essential that Tunbridge is upgraded to ensure that it can be roadworthy for many decades to come. The existing bridge was an ageing structure, and its replacement is a complex engineering challenge, not least due to the presence of many hidden utility cables."

From the Hampshire County Council website:

The extension to the original estimated completion date of November is due to a number of unexpected issues including the discovery of more extensive deterioration to the existing structure, delays to utility works, as well as significant vandalism from an unauthorised encampment earlier in the year.

Despite the extension of the timetable, steps are being taken to ensure that:

- Walkers and cyclists will still be able to pass through the site
- Car parking will remain available nearby
- Access to the Handlebar café will be available at all times.
