

Dear friends,



Lambs' ears have been spotted in the churchyard! Not the ones belonging to a cute woolly creature, but you can see from this photo how this plant got its popular name (also known as Stachys byzantina).

I'm no expert on flowers, so I learnt a lot on a sunny afternoon in early June, looking at all the plant life in St Bartholomew's churchyard. You can read about the 'Churches Count on Nature' project and see more photos of just some of the beautiful flowers on pages 21-22. Fortunately for me, the iNaturalist app helped us to put names to flowery faces, from the tiny scarlet pimpernel to

the big showy roses. It was quite a treat to have an excuse to spend a few hours getting up close to the beauty of nature: the dainty detail of even the smallest self-seeding flowering "weeds" was an object lesson in the care and creativity with which God has blessed our world. I know that many people, including some who wouldn't dream of setting foot in the church, find something spiritually uplifting about sitting quietly in that beautiful setting, the peace and colour a balm for souls that are disturbed and beset by shadows. Nature is a powerful healing force.

The summer months are traditionally a time for holidays, and even if it's not possible to go away for a while, 'a change is as good as a rest', as they say. So instead of following the same routines all summer long, why not set aside some time for an intentional 'holiday at home' or mini retreat? Give yourself permission to spend some time just 'being' in a place where you feel at peace, perhaps in a public garden, or the churchyard, or down by the river. For some that might even be in a busy public place, where you don't feel lonely but are able to sit back and watch the bustle going on around you. Try to set aside all the things on your mind just for a while, and really notice your surroundings, the sights, the sounds, the smells. You might like to offer some words to God about anything that particularly catches your attention, or take your Bible and look up some of these passages that express the wonder of the presence and glory of God in creation:

Psalm 8; Psalm 19; Psalm 23; Psalm 46; Psalm 100; Psalm 121; Psalm 139.1-18

A Prayer for Experiencing God in Nature (from reclaimtoday.org)

Creator God, at the beginning of time your voice brought light into the darkness.

Your hands shaped dry land. Your creativity exploded in colours and shapes and smells. And your breath brought life to all creatures. As I step outside, may I discover the light of your presence, hear your purpose-giving voice of direction, and be amazed and inspired by your creativity. And as I breathe in fresh air, may you fill me with the breath of your Spirit who brings me true peace, rest, and strength. Amen.

Whatever the summer holds for you, may God restore your soul with the assurance of his love - even in the mists of uncertainty or anxiety.

We currently live-stream very simply using a mobile phone. Please bear with us if there are any temporary problems with our online broadcast and forgive us if there are any significant technical issues. We strive to ensure that all of our online events are held safely and without technical hitches but it is impossible to eliminate these completely and so we apologise in advance should there be any disruptions.

At St Swithun's there will be Evensong instead of the usual second-Sunday Holy Communion, so there will be no Holy Communion at St Swithun's in August. Bishop David is to visit St Swithun's for Holy Communion on 10th December.

Deacons have been part of the leadership of the Church of Christ ever since its earliest days. The ministry is first mentioned in Acts 6.1-7, when the apostles realised they needed help with the practical running of the community, so that they could focus on their priorities, which were to preach and to pray. Women were included from earliest times, for example Phoebe, whom Paul mentions in his epistle to the Romans (16.12).

Since then deacons have always been ordained ministers and became part of the Church's threefold ministry of bishops, priests and deacons. Originally deacons were answerable primarily to the bishop, and they organised the charitable work of the church. Well known deacons include St Lawrence and St Francis of Assisi.

Today all ordained people start out as deacons, and although most are 'transitional deacons' (becoming priests after a year), for some, being a deacon is a vocation in its own right. They are called 'distinctive' to distinguish them from those who spend an initial period in ordained ministry as deacons before becoming priests. There are many deacons in the Anglican Communion all over the world, as well as in the Roman Catholic, Orthodox and Methodist churches.

In the Church of England deacons are thought of as boundary-crossers. They are always looking 'out' from the church, asking how the church and the Christian faith can cross the boundary with the gospel to those who do not yet know Christ, and to those who are in need. This generally means that people with a diaconal calling do not wish to spend most of their ministry inside the church building. The distinctive diaconate is for those who are strongly drawn to the go-between ministry, seeking out the lost sheep and bringing both the message of the gospel and the practical care that goes with it to the unchurched.

Festival of Archaeology

Festival of Archaeology: Hyde900 Community Digs display and medieval tile making

Outside the Museum, Hyde900 representatives will be on hand to talk about the annual community digs, archaeological finds, and the history and architecture of Hyde Abbey. On display will be all sorts of exciting archaeological finds from Hyde, showcasing the lives of those who lived nearly a century ago in this area.



Experts and a team member of Winchester Excavations Committee will be present to discuss specialist areas of pottery, ceramics, geophysical surveying, medieval glass, stonemasonry, and monastic architecture.

Children are well catered for, with opportunities to rebuild the Abbey and sort the finds from previous digs! Courtesy of the Hampshire Cultural Trust, the ever-popular medieval tile making will also be taking place in the City Museum over the festival. Tile makers of all ages will be able to make their own replicas of tiles found on the site of Hyde Abbey and for a small fee they can have their efforts fired and glazed.

The Community Dig Saturday 26th - Tuesday 29th August 2023

Once again Hyde900 will be putting on their annual community dig on the site of Hyde Abbey, the final resting place of Alfred the Great. Previous digs have uncovered the remains of the Abbey church and cloisters in the gardens of residents, who live in what was the Inner Close of the Abbey. In the past finds have included materials from the construction of the Abbey, which was largely destroyed in the years following the Dissolution of the Monasteries. Last year the dig had the added excitement of locating a cellar which had been rumoured to exist in one of the gardens.

The dig is open to all, aged 5 and upwards, who can take part in 2-hour sessions. It gives adults and children the opportunity to get involved to find the remains of Hyde Abbey, whether by digging or by processing and recording the finds.

On Saturday 16th September, 2-3pm, St Lawrence will again host a poetry reading event.


Poets from Winchester Muse (Winchester's Premier Poetry Platform) will be reading original poems on the theme of '*Celebrity Unwrapped*'.



Daphne Clark MBE, 1931-2023

We were very sad to announce the death of Daphne Clark, who died on 11th May, aged 92.

Daphne was born in London, where her parents were florists. In the Second World War, when children and families were being evacuated to the country, the family lived for two years in the basement of the business, for safety, before moving further out, to Barnes, which became Daphne's beloved home for many years.

Leaving school at 18 with her Higher School Certificate, Daphne was attracted to housing management, as social work with a practical outcome. Having qualified in Housing Management, Daphne moved

from Chelsea to Barnes Borough Council, where she enjoyed working across the social divide of council estates and the private sector.

In 1958 she married Ian, whom she had met in her teens at St Mary's Church, Barnes. There they had both been heavily involved with youth work and they continued to take active roles in the community in several ways, such as Sunday School, Fellowships, Scouting, and the Church Council.

After their children Jonathan and Diana were born (in 1959 and 1960), Daphne returned to housing work, at a time when the government was encouraging housing associations with finance grants and loans. Daphne helped to found and was the Director of the Richmond-upon-Thames Church Housing Trust, which flourished and grew to absorb other housing trusts. It employed many local people and became a training office for many years. Daphne became highly regarded in the world of social housing for the energetic way she sought, over many years, to advance the case for increased investment for affordable housing for the homeless and those in need. Although she was very modest about her achievements and didn't like a fuss being made, she was rewarded with appointment as an MBE in the 1983 New Year Honours.

After 20 years of running Richmond-upon-Thames Church Housing Trust, Daphne retired in 1991, only to join the management councils of several housing associations all over the country, which she enjoyed for 10 years. Then, at 70, she moved to Winchester, leaving her life in London behind, to support her son Jonathan and help look after her beloved grandchildren, Grace, Benjamin, Henry, Joseph and Reuben.

She volunteered at the Cathedral, and made many friends at St Lawrence, until a brain haemorrhage at the age of 80 sadly curtailed her activity. At 85 she decided to move to Brendoncare Park Road, where she lived for the remainder of her 92 years.

Daphne is remembered as an erudite but unassuming woman, with a passion for people and their stories, and whose character and life's work were profoundly rooted in and shaped by her Christian faith. It helped her to face with great stoicism the many challenges and tragedies that life threw at her, including losing her daughter, husband and then five years ago her son. She was fond of saying that whenever she felt lost, she would stick out her hand and let God show her the way. She was blessed with great wit and humour; she loved her cats, birds and flowers, and a good cup of tea, and was an avid letter-writer to numerous life-long friends that she had collected over the years. She wrote down the stories of her own life in many notebooks, including these words: 'Step right out on the road of life: only the brave succeed. Laugh at the rocks and nasty knocks, that would your way impede.' The closing hymn that she chose for her funeral was "O Jesus I have promised to serve thee to the end". And so she did: may she rest in peace.

St Bartholomew's Counts on Nature

St Bartholomew's churchyard is a beautiful place to sit, and there's always something colourful to see there, thanks to the assiduous care of some lovely gardening volunteers. For the second year running we took part in 'Churches Count on Nature', a national initiative promoted jointly by Caring for God's Acre (the conservation charity for Burial Grounds across the UK), the Church of England, the Church in Wales and A Rocha UK. 2023 is its second year, and it is part of 'Love your Burial Ground Week' which has been running for many years.

Their website says "Burial grounds are fantastic places for biodiversity, often containing species-rich grassland which was once widespread in the UK. The walls and monuments create habitat for amphibians, reptiles, small mammals and invertebrates as well as ferns, mosses and liverworts. Of the 2,000 lichen species in the UK, 700 are found in churchyards, with a third of these rarely found elsewhere. The UK holds a globally important population of veteran and ancient yew trees, of which three-quarters are found in the churchyards of England and Wales. There are about 800 of these ancient and veteran yews, aged from 500 to several 1,000 years old, with no known upper age limit. Burial grounds may also contain veteran trees of other species, acting as hosts to a wealth of associated plants, animals, lichen and fungi." Churches are encouraged to contribute to a national database that is being built, and to get the community involved in cherishing these important spaces.



Our event was on Saturday 3rd June, a beautifully sunny afternoon when the garden at St Bartholomew's was looking particularly lovely, so it was a joy to spend time looking more closely at all the varieties of plants that are there. With the help of the iNaturalist app, some local expertise and some gardening books, we were able to contribute 127 plant observations to the national database, covering 86 species. Many thanks to Catherine Reynolds for her help all afternoon, and to Chris Pilgrim for coming and taking some great photos!

We concentrated on the plants but had also set up a children's activity trail looking at 'Small But Mighty' insects (from a children's activity website we often use for churchyard trails: <u>www.sunhatsandwellieboots.com</u>). We are sure there must be a great variety of bugs and creepy crawlies in the churchyard, and there are swifts in the swift boxes, which have been kindly donated by Andy and Julia Wainewright. Next year we hope more people will join in with what turned out to be a fascinating, educational and uplifting afternoon.

Winchester Diocese Mothers' Union

The Diocesan Mothers' Union gathers members of its various branches together every year for a Festival Service, and this year asked to hold it at St Lawrence, instead of in the Cathedral. We were delighted to agree, and it seemed very apt as St Lawrence is the 'mother church' of the city. The service was held on 20th June, with Bishop David preaching and presiding.

The readings were 1 Peter 4.7-11 and John 6.5-13: Bishop David spoke about how, when we give something small, God can make something out of it that is bigger than we could have imagined. Thinking about a little boy's bread and fish lunch that was given to Jesus, possibly reluctantly, but then fed not only the boy but thousands of other people, Bishop David encouraged the



congregation to think about what their own personal equivalent of that lunch might be.

The Mothers' Union started in 1876 as one small gathering in Alresford Rectory to help support local mums, and is now a proactive and influential lay Christian movement, with over 4 million members in 84 countries across the globe. They work at grassroots level against poverty, inequality and injustice, bringing hope and practical support to millions of people every year through parenting, literacy and community development programmes, bringing about real change for family life, women's and girls' rights, and the protection of children. The Mothers' Union is not 'a union of' mothers but 'an advocate for' them and for the transformation of community life: membership is open to all, whether married or single, female or male.

Here is a list of donations sought, followed by what will not be welcome:

Yes please: Agricultural tools: fork, spade, hoe, garden rake, hand fork and trowel, lopper, secateurs and hand shears Builders' tools: spade, shovel, 3ft spirit level, axe, crowbar, fork, sledgehammer, bow saw, bolsters, chisels, all types of hammers and trowels, pin and lines, tape measures, hacksaws and Stanley and hacksaw blades. Carpenters' tools: bevel, braces, clamps, hand drills and bits, all types of files and hammers, Stanley knife, all types of planes and saws, pliers, rules, all types of saws and screwdrivers, squares plus screws, nails and bolts. Electricians' tools: allen keys, hand drills and bits, all types of pliers and hacksaws, screwdrivers, spanners, soldering iron, voltmeter. Motor mechanics' tools: allen keys, cold chisels, breast drill and bits, all types of hammers and pliers, punches, metric socket sets, spanners, adjustable spanners, cantilever toolboxes, tyre pressure gauge. Plumbers' tools: basin or tap wrench, wire brush, breast drill and bits, various grips and saws, screwdriver, oil can etc. Garage workshop: hydraulic jack, axle stands, battery charger, ramps and large engineer's vice. Power tools: hand and bench drills, sander, planer, jigsaw, circular, band and chop saws, lathe, cultivator, rotavator, welding machine and generator. Sewing machines: manual, electric, treadle and industrial. Knitting machines: machine and hand, wool, needles and patterns. Haberdashery: needles, cottons, large material pieces/rolls, buttons, zips, tapes. Fully working IT equipment: desktop computers and laptops running a minimum of Microsoft Windows 7, tablets. Bibles: in modern English.

No thank you: It's not about what we want, it's about what people can use. What may be useful to us, may not be useful to recipients in our partner countries. If we say we can't take something, we're not being ungrateful, we're just being honest: No broken tools - we can sharpen and remove surface rust, but can't repair or take tools with woodworm. No: Ladders and step ladders. Lawn rakes/long-handled shears. Electric and hand lawnmowers. Printers, scanners, typewriters. Disability aids: walking frames, wheelchairs, medicines and glasses. Clothes and shoes. Bikes: men's, women's and children's. Books. Embroidery materials, curtains and weaving materials. Cooking pots, pans and kitchen utensils, crockery and cutlery, household appliances and musical instruments. This isn't an exhaustive list, just the main things we're offered by well-meaning supporters on a regular basis.

Please note: Sometimes people donate tools that are not suitable to send to Africa, either due to their age or because they would not be used. We also have some tools donated in such quantities that we cannot use all of them. On these occasions, we will attempt to sell the items to raise vital funds for our work.






