



Dear Friends,

We drove cross-country a few days ago, to visit the family, and I was amazed to see such an abundance of white blossom. The edges of the road were fringed with cow parsley, the hedges full of great swathes of white flowers which I took to be blackthorn. The horse chestnuts were also in full bloom with their mainly white candelabras, and all else seemed to be that lovely fresh green that only a sunny spring morning can produce.

After much discussion and some Googling, I now know that some of the hedges will have been hawthorn (which I thought was usually pink), and now I also know that blackthorn flowers before the leaves have unfurled, and hawthorn after. 'Every day a school day' and never too old to learn!

In spite of all the beauty we are at last seeing, after what felt like a very long, cold and wet winter, signs of the change that comes with global warming are around us all, but affecting others so much more than us, at present.

Aid agencies do a fantastic job picking up the pieces, and our giving to them is important, but we also need to take responsibility for how our own lives and lifestyles impact the environment. As I am no longer able to drive, I can sit smugly on the bus knowing that I have not personally

caused too much damage on this or that particular journey, by sharing it with the others who for various reasons are travelling on public transport, too. The truth remains that public transport would not have got us to our granddaughters' Christenings last weekend - no buses run out of our village on a Sunday and no buses or trains would have ferried us about between the Cotswold villages for the special occasion, either.

#### What to do?

We do what we can. We can use our votes for change - to lead to more environmentally friendly initiatives and solutions to the problems that face us; we can be more rigorous about our recycling; we can choose less plastic in our shopping for food and go for refills more often. We are in the hands of those who supply our needs but it is also our voice that creates a market for better and more sustainable ways of living.

As spring turns into summer, enjoy the beauty and wonder of it all. Notice all the small things that make our lives amazing. Give thanks to God for all we have and pray for better ways to live and preserve the natural world, in all its glory.

# Changes to services in July and August

Some services in July and August will diverge from the regular pattern:

On 16<sup>th</sup> July at St Swithun's Church there will be Holy Communion at 6pm for the church's patronal festival, but on 9<sup>th</sup> July the service will be Evensong, not Holy Communion.

On 13<sup>th</sup> August at St Lawrence Church there will be Holy Communion at 10am for the church's patronal festival. Bishop David will preside and preach. At St Swithun's there will be Evensong instead of the usual second-Sunday Holy Communion, so there will be no Holy Communion at St Swithun's in August. Bishop David is to visit St Swithun's for Holy Communion on 10<sup>th</sup> December.

When I first met Bill, soon after he moved into the Care Home, he told me of his great regret that, although he had been baptised as a young man, he had never been confirmed and thought it was now too late. Bishop David very graciously agreed to come and put that right, and it was a really joyful occasion, attended by about 20 residents. Bill had no hesitation in choosing 'Amazing Grace' and 'How Great Thou Art' as his favourite hymns, which everyone sang with gusto. After the service, we enjoyed a delicious celebration cake and tea together.

Originally from Weston-Super-Mare, Bill's working life was with Westland Helicopters, having developed a love of these machines during his National Service at RAF Kinloss. He was also a keen motorbike rider, and used to do trials. Moving to Hampshire in retirement, with his wife Christine, he became a member of Winchester Probus. Sadly, Christine was unable to get to the service because this was the day that Winchester was at a standstill due to the tragic fatal accident that closed the M3 for most of the day.

The National "Great Big Green Week" is a celebration of community action to tackle climate change, started by Climate Coalition in June 2021, as June is an easier time access to politicians. This year it takes place **between 10 - 18 June 2023**.

Winchester Green Week is always held during the month of Creationtide and this year is being held **23 September - 1 October.** It is very much linked into the national Green Week ethos. Consequently, as a Benefice, we support Winchester Green Week.

Last year more than 70 events were co-ordinated by 50 organizations. We held a Recycle Sunday and had a speaker from A Rocha Eco Church.

This year the theme is "Let's grow greener, together" involving four possible sections: Environment, Social, Aesthetic, and Spiritual.

As the United Benefice's Environmental Officer, I would like to involve all of you lovely parishioners of both Parishes, to help me define the four sections within a display on the walls of St Lawrence Church (similar to what I have done before). I hope to explain further at the end of a church service in each church and in the July Magazine. Ultimately, I would like our visitors to our City based church of St Lawrence to see how a United Benefice promotes "Going greener together" and to take thoughts away with them that will lead to greener action, in their own lives.




Did you know that The Crown is patron of our two parishes? This dates back to the Dissolution of the Monasteries, when Henry VIII took over the monks' lands and patronages. Today we are one of about 650 benefices that retain this patronage, and the appointment of the Rector is made on behalf of the Crown by the Church Appointments Team in the Cabinet Office. So it was very fitting that we celebrated the Coronation of King Charles in style, with special services of thanksgiving in each of our churches.



The bunting was up at St Bartholomew's and all of our churches were beautifully adorned with flowers for our special services on Sunday 7th May, the day after the Coronation itself. Each service finished with the National Anthem, and plenty of coronation-themed cake was consumed with the morning coffee! In the churchyard at St Bartholomew's there was also a children's activity trail, with interesting facts about the coronation and a puzzle to solve.

# Coronation Thanksgiving - All Together Service

The Coronation service began with a child greeting the King and welcoming him "in the name of the King of Kings." The King replied "In His name, and after His example, I come, not to be served but to serve." The whole weekend was designed to celebrate 'Community, Faith and Service'.

There was a very powerful moment in the coronation service when the King appeared in very simple clothes, without all the trappings of status, and was anointed, that is, set apart and consecrated to God for the particular ways in which he is called to serve. Each of us is called in our own way: we too are dependent on the strength and grace of God, who names and calls us to be citizens of his Kingdom in different ways. Like the King at his coronation, we, at baptism, are anointed and consecrated to God, precious in his sight, called by name and equipped by the Holy Spirit for a life of service.



So we wondered what a coronation might look like using items that are symbols of *our* calling, just as the King was presented

with regalia that represent his new role. Our 'King' Malcolm Thorpe ascended up the chancel step to his throne and was presented with various items that represent the kinds of ways in which we can serve one another, both practically and symbolically:

The Regalia of State	The Regalia of the Kingdom of God
A Jewelled Sword for the protection of good	<b>A broom</b> , for sweeping away unclean things and any obstacles in people's way to a life of hope and peace
The Armills or Bracelets of Sincerity and Wisdom	<b>A teatowel</b> , sign of humility and willingness to get stuck in
A Robe (of righteousness)	<b>An apron</b> , for hospitality; providing nourishment for body, mind or spirit
The Orb, symbolising the world under the cross of Christ	<b>A first aid kit</b> , for making things better, patching up and healing
A Glove, symbol of protection of the people, holding power gently in a gloved hand	<b>A washing-up glove</b> , for holding lightly to status and not being afraid when things get messy
The Sceptre (a sign of temporal authority) and the Rod of Equity and Mercy, symbol of spiritual and pastoral care for his people	<b>A feather duster</b> , for taking care of our environment; for clearing away the specks that cloud our vision and judgement
A Crown, the symbol of sacrificial vocation under the cross of Christ	<b>A crown</b> , with the cross drawn on our foreheads at baptism, the symbol of being precious to God and citizens of His eternal kingdom



Our churches, indeed our society, would not function without volunteers and for Christians it's not just a choice but a duty and responsibility, to follow after the example of Christ who came, not to be served, but to serve. There are always things to do and ways that we can help, no matter what our age or experience. You might like to think of other meanings for the items above, or other symbols of Christian service. I wonder what you would choose as a symbol of *your* faith-filled service to the community?

## Watch out for spam emails!

Spammers are getting cleverer at putting together more believable emails. Do check names, spellings and odd phrasing, also where the email comes from (e.g. on an iPad or iPhone, tap the sender name to show the email address).

Just have a look at what 'Revd Karen' sent to one of our editors:

Caroline? D Spam × → Rev. Karen Kousseff <prayerrectory2@gmail.com> to me 💌 Are you available? I have a request for you to manage discreetly. I will appreciate a swift correspondence via email. Blessings, Reverend Karen Kousseff (no subject) D Spam × Revd. Karen Kousseff <reverend.officedesk912@gmail.com>  $\bigcirc$ to me 👻 Why is this message in spam? It is similar to messages that were identified as spam in the past. Report not spam In God We Trust! Is there a free minute for you now? I quickly need your help. I will await your email. Blessings

It's usually a giveaway if the email does not address you by name, and please be suspicious if it doesn't sound like the way the 'writer' would normally communicate. If in any doubt, don't reply to the email but phone the person. The email may give some excuse why they cannot talk on the phone: this is itself a reason for suspicion.

## Cycling and exploring Hampshire's historic churches for people who love exploring church buildings

Did you know that every year over 400 of Hampshire's most historic and beautiful churches are open to cyclists? What's more, some have refreshments and guides and all will provide a beautiful backdrop to catch your breath and give you a chance to discover beauty, art, history and interesting architecture inside and out.

Last year Ride & Stride in Hampshire raised over £47,000 of sponsorship money, including Gift Aid, to help Christian churches of all denominations who are members of 'Churches Together in England'.

The money raised every year helps to fund repairs to the historic fabric and features of the churches as well as urgent repairs such as retaining walls in graveyards, leaky roofs and the installation facilities to make Hampshire's historic churches, chapels and meeting houses of all denominations fit to serve local communities for future generations. In recent years, all our three churches have benefited from thee grants.

This year's Ride & Stride will be on Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> September, during the week of Winchester Heritage Open Days. The cycling team at St Bart's intend to ride to a number of churches along the Itchen Valley on to raise money for Hampshire and the Islands Historic Churches Trust (HIHCT). Half of the money they raise will go to HIHCT, and half to the Giving for Living at St Bart's Appeal. **For St Lawrence with St Swithun parish**, Clare and Louise won't be organising Ride & Stride in the same way as they did in the past: the parish won't formally field a team, though of course individuals are welcome to participate and Clare and Louise can advise on the forms needed. In the same way as at St Bart's, half the money raised will go to HIHCT and half to the parish's funds. Also, Clare and Louise will still arrange a rota of stewards for both churches so that R & S participants and other visitors will find a welcome on 9<sup>th</sup> September, and the parish will probably have a retiring collection for HIHCT on the 10<sup>th</sup> September.




